This WGSSS Application Form for ESRC doctoral studentship awards focuses on your proposed programme of research and your potential for doctoral-level research. The form asks you for a range of information, and you should complete all of the fields that apply to your individual circumstances.

Sections 1-6 of this form must be completed by you as the applicant. However, we encourage you to discuss your application with your supervisor and allow enough time to develop a robust proposal and programme of research. Section 7 must be completed by the supervisor who has agreed to supervise your project.

It is vital that you take into account the deadlines for the application process, which are detailed on the <u>WGSSS website</u>. Please also be aware that individual universities often have internal deadlines for applications, so do seek guidance from the pathway or school department you are applying to and make sure that you allow plenty of time to complete the application.

You can only submit one project proposal and application for WGSSS funding in the General Studentship Competition. Applicants are not permitted to submit multiple applications across our partner universities.

Please ensure that you observe the word limits for each field, as set out in the form. WGSSS reserves the right to reject over-length applications outright. Applicants are not permitted to include images or graphs within their application.
